Descending from China in grand, graceful arcs, the upper Mekong unfuris in a tranqui, lulling sken. Only bartlement ruins to the south betray the region's heritage, a blood-soaked clash of empires, contested by Thal, Burmese, Luctian and Khmer armies for centuries. Fortresses and royal cities are now all but swallowed by jungle and femalism.

The once-remote Golden Triangle at the morthern tip of Thailand is now a haven for peaceful contemplation in dozens of ten ples and shrines, from gilded palaces to a cret grottoes, where you can meditate to the sound of water dripping on limestome or ti chattering of monkeys. One mountain ou cropping has become a favorite for passis elephants, who gaze over the mists Myanmar and Lans beyond.

Over the last few decades the area has been rediscovered. As they reclaim it from the drug smugglers and blissed-out backpackers who made in noterious in the 1970s, travelers today find a bracing climate—it can be 25 degrees cooler at night here than in the coastal cities—along with natural beauty, werdant courtyard lodgings, riverfront restaurants and street markets where a handful of fat, juicy grifted cleadas can cost just a dollar.

№ 3 P.M. > OLD TOWN CYCLING

Near the center of Chiang Saen, hop onto a rental at Fat Free Bicycle Shop, (around 450 baht, or 543 a day) and weave past temples, food stands and antiques stalls. Roads are spacious and in excellent condition throughout the district, traffic is sedate, and even the occasional swarm of motorbikes will let you pass. Stalls on the main street, Phabalpothia. Road, offer simple, carefully-prepared dishes, from chickong grilled on bamboo stalks to river fish steamed with herbs, With fresh-squeezed fruit juice, yurll pay about 130 baht. More adventurous plates can wenture into the Simsombum Market to sample specialities such as free frog legs or wasp larvae smoked in the new which are white and puffy, like popcorn.



@ 9:30 A.M. > CHINESE OUTPOST

Brave the swarms of macaques at the tiny Yunnanese village and temple Wat Tham



Pla to find a steep staircase flanked by jeaning dragon claws. After a brisk climb, you will reach the Fish Tail Cave, a hundred noist, chalky yards ending in a devotional space of utter silence. On a small ledge to he side, a humble chipped and age-spotted part with an enigmatic smile looks more an-mist than Buddhist. On the way back, you'll ace graind views of the Burmese ridges that become the Himalayas. At the stairs' base, roungsters scamper around a flut poord where you can buy crumbs for the lake carp, an offering to the local goddess of mercy.

G 11 A.M. > HILLTOP REDOUBT
Winding roads lined with craft shops end at
the newly restored headquarters of one of
Southeast Asia's last warlords. Khun Sa
may be reviled as a drug gangster who
flooded the United States with cheap heroin
in the 1970s, but here he receives a statesman's deference in homespun displays tracling his rise to commander of an army, receiving emissaries from prime ministers
and kings. Pose with a stern life-size effigy
in his original office.

♠ 1:30 P.M. → PROVENCE ON THE MEKONO Nestle into an open-air island of Gallic hos-pitality complete with Art Nouveau posters and tumblers of absinthe. Lavallee Restaur-nut serves a melange of backyard herbs and vegetables with grilled meats. Phone aihead to place an order; about 350 bath per person. An attached gallery sells handicrafts of the local Alcha people, who of-ten show off their traditional dress as well. Just over a foothridge, a much grander gallery proclaims itself in a riot of color and sculpture. The nationally famed artist. Sri-wan Janehuttakarnkit presides over the

wall-size expressionistic paintings of musi-cians, parties, skeletons and jungles with happy elephant families.

@ 7 P.M. ➤ RIVERFRONT REPAST

(I) TEM. > RIVERFRONT REPAST with nightime strollers and a karracke bar on one side, the moonlit Mekong on the other, you can lounge on ratian mats and cushions as the last long-tail craft drift by. The Roseng Poy sidewalk cafe stays open late, bringing out grilled fish, sturdy cur-ries, pungent saileds and magnum-size bo-tles of beer in such large portions and on such tiny tables that sharing is the only op-tion. About 300 balu.

Sunday

1 8:30 A.M. > RITUALS AND PHOTO OPS

Salo A.M. > RITUALS AND PHOTO OPS
Shelter from the morning rain and rising heat by this shaded cliff overlooking War Pra That Pukhao, where fith-century worshipers made their altar, now on display is a small stuccoed Buddha of great antiquity. Several long lights of steps connect this rough-hewed temple to an extensive complex of temples on the heights, Whele dozens of Buddhas gleam and monks explain devotional rituals, Most visitors head straight to an elaborate ceremonial gateway built for photo ops of the panoramic upriver views.

11 A.M. > THE OPIUM POPPY

A huge contemporary museum details the career of that most influential local crop, the opium poppy. Old-achool displays at the Hall of Opium Museum teel the story through non-Western eyes, as the engine of an imperialism that captured almost all of East Asia, and made the area the epicenter of a gruesome global trade. The emphasis here is on the present, the human toil of addiction and efforts to keep the culture of the area's hill tribes intact. Admission, 300 baht.

⊕ 3 P.M. > A NEVER-ENDING CYCLE

Just before you arrive at Chiang Rai's airport, the White Temple depicts the Buddhist
cycle of life and death, Outside is a duzzling

inside, a vast mural of modern delusions
that distract us from the divine, including
cellphones and pop stars. Enter vin a footbridge that spans a writhing, grasping
